If you meet the following Unique Admission Requirements:

UNIQUE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be a determined a qualified applicant, the following qualifications must be satisfactorily completed prior to submitting an application or the student must be currently attending the courses when the application is submitted.

GPA: High school cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 1.50 required to be accepted on a probationary status
- College GPA is also considered if high school GPA is lower than 2.00, but college is higher (minimum of 12 credits).
- If denied for either a high school or college GPA lower than 1.50, establishing a “new” GPA with 12 college credits of 2.00 or higher will allow admittance in a subsequent semester.

How to Apply for a Program

Fill out the [Online Application Form](#) and submit the \$35 fee (\$30 application fee and \$5 processing fee) payable by credit card, debit card or electronic check by the [application deadline](#).

Paper applications are available by request at any Enrollment Center, or regional or metro campus office. Request a paper application from the Enrollment Center by phone at (608) 246-6210 or (800) 322-6282, Ext. 6210. In addition to the \$30 application fee, there is a \$10 non-refundable processing fee to submit a paper application.

Required Documents for this Program

The following materials must be on file at Madison College in order to have a complete application:

- Completed Application form
- One of the following:
 - Official high school transcript*
 - Official GED/HSED transcript*
 - Official college transcript showing an Associate’s, Bachelor’s or higher degree from an institution other than Madison College*
 - A completed COMPASS test may be substituted in place of high school or GED/HSED transcripts

If the application packet is incomplete at the time of the application deadline, the application will not be processed and the applicant will need to reapply for a future term. The online application only allows one application per term.

*If high school, GED/HSED and/or college transcripts are on file at Madison College, they do not need to be submitted again. To obtain transcripts, contact the school(s) the student attended or, the GED/HSED Testing Center the student attended. Transcript(s) should be sent directly to:

If you meet the Unique Admission Requirements and complete the application process, your application will progress to the review stage of processing to see if you are a qualified applicant for the indicated program.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

FINANCIAL AID

ASSESS SKILLS FOR PROPER COURSE PLACEMENT

COMPASS (Computer-Adaptive Placement Assessment and Support System)

This is an untimed test which is taken on a computer. The purpose of this test is to assess the student's current academic skills. The test results are used for advising purposes to help students register for the appropriate level courses.
